

From the desk of Doug Wiggins, City Administrator

This past month we have observed a cooldown over the last couple weeks. As far as the City, we have been buttoning up some of our outdoor projects and beginning to setup for some of our winter projects. City Hall has been busy this fall cleaning on the upstairs of City Hall and tidying up the records room and other storage areas. It has been quite the transformation upstairs in ridding the storage rooms of outdated materials and cleaning the dust off the shelves.

Many happenings have been going on this past month and City Council has been busy working on many issues. Issues ranging from zoning, fencing ordinances, animal ordinances, ATV's and general City business.

- complaints as of late have been predominantly about ATV usage in Union. While we have placed some advertising in the newsletter about the issue, I cannot reiterate enough the rules for ATV usage in Union and have provided them here below (Chapter 70);
 - A. All-terrain vehicles (ATVs), golf carts, neighborhood electric vehicles (NEVs) and nonconforming vehicles may be operated on all streets and roads within the City of Union, that are open to the public, except that the vehicles may not travel on any state highway within the city other than to cross the highway. Snowmobiles are not authorized to be operated on public streets within the city limits, except on officially designated routes established by resolution of the City Council.
 - B. ATVs, golf carts and NEVs may only be operated on public streets by licensed drivers. 16 years of age or older. Nonconforming vehicles may be operated by drivers 12 years of age or older without a license.
 - ATVs must comply with all safety equipment requirements, including sound emissions under O.R.S. 821.030, and with all general motor vehicle operation regulations and rules of the road pursuant to O.R.S. Chapter 811, and general operation pursuant to O.R.S. Chapter 815, with the exception of seatbelt requirements under O.R.S. 815.055 and windshield wiper requirements under O.R.S. 815.215.
 - D. Class I and Class II ATVs, must meet one of the financial responsibility requirements under O.R.S. 806.060.
 - E. Golf carts, NEVs and other nonconforming vehicles are not required to meet any of the financial responsibility requirements under O.R.S. 806.060.

(Ord. 477, passed 1-14-2002)

These rules were established to make it safe for residents to get around and enjoy ATV usage within City limits. Additionally, I would like to add that the ATV must be used as it has been designed. Too many times, staff has observed ATV operators on City Streets without proper headwear or riding with excessive amounts of passengers.







Burning is allowed beginning October 1st, with a burn permit issued by the City of Union. You can obtain a burn permit at City Hall. Burn permits are \$10.00 and are valid for each calendar year.


Please remember, you can only burn the following:

- ✓ Dry leaves
- ✓ Twigs
- ✓ Un-waxed paper and cardboard

ABSOLUTELY NO GARBAGE

All fires must be completely out by dusk.

Time to Fall Back! Nov 3rd, 2019

Don't forget it's also time to change the batteries in your smoke detectors!

A smoke alarm is an inexpensive way to protect your family from smoke and fire injuries, but you must take the time to test it to ensure that it's working properly. A properly functioning smoke detector doubles your chance of surviving a fire by warning you of a dangerous situation before it's too late.

While you're up checking your battery every month, also brush or vacuum the alarm to keep dirt and dust out of the mechanism. Never use cleaning sprays or solvents that can enter the unit and contaminate sensors. The general rule is, if your smoke alarm is 10 years old or older, it is time to replace it.

We understand that no parent wants their child riding their bikes, skateboards or scooters on main street. But are you aware of the risks and dangers of your child riding on the sidewalk?

Get ready for winter's wallop!

The Public Works Department wants you to know there are a few things you can do now while the weather is still mild to ward off costly problems this winter. Here are a few suggestions:



- If you haven't had your chimneys cleaned in a while....this is the time
- Make your house more energy efficient by adding insulation where needed, caulking around windows and doors, install storm windows and repair any cracked or broken windows.
- Instead of scrambling for repairs in the bitter cold of winter after a furnace blows, have your furnace serviced now. Check, clean or replace furnace filters monthly.
- > To stop those cold drafts from entering your home, install a door sweep under exterior doors.
- Insulate hot water pipes in your basement or crawl space by placing foam sleeves or heat wrap on them. Even a little bit of ice inside a pipe can cause pressure buildup and eventual bursting or backflow. But unfortunately, you likely won't know there's a problem until that breaking point happens
- Remove hoses from outside faucets and insulate with foam covers.
- Check frost free hydrants for leaks
