4. COMMITTEE DISCUSSIONS:

a) Committee Discussions and Guidance

Mayor Flint asked if any committees have met. Councilor Hawkins said the ordinance committee met today and figured out a method for going over the ordinances. We will meet the first and third Monday's. We will bring regular updates to CA Wiggins. Councilor Richter said the Ranger Station committee hasn't met.

CA Wiggins said we are still waiting on the kitchen cabinets for the Ranger Station so we can finish the plumbing. We are working on the outside as well.

Councilor Cox said we met on Friday night for the Fire/EMS/Library. Council and staff discussed completing an annexing into the rural fire district which would be easier than voting in a new district entirely. We still have to find more information on it. We are meeting to find more information.

Councilor Cox said on the economic development committee I have been asking for information on people who can get an economic assessment and community assessment completed. Council and staff discussed what the assessments need and the costs. They continued to discuss what the assessment will look at and the cost of it.

Councilor McMillan said I haven't made contact with the park committee. CA Wiggins said we did get the fence ordered for the park playground; we are working on a contractor to install it. We will also want to get more cameras on the back half of the park because the front half is covered. We also need to put in more lights on the back part of the park too.

- b) Fire/Ems - Merger - SEL 802 & 805 - Resolution

CA Wiggins said I am working with our city attorney on this. She is ready to move forward with us on this. We do need to have public hearings on this as well.

6. OTHER:


- a) Clean Up Day - May 14, 2022
