The public works department continues to be busy with new water and sewer connections, street repairs, the CDBG well project and the upcoming wastewater treatment facility maintenance and cleaning project. In addition to the normal locates and daily work, the crew has been busy knocking projects off the list. Many thanks to a great crew.

The Planning Commission has been busy this summer brushing up on their knowledge of city Ordinances each month with a work session. Thank you to those on the commission who give of their time each month. Public attendance is always welcome at all planning commission meetings which occur on the third Wednesday of each month at 7pm. If there are planning applications to review, there will be a work session at 6pm that evening and the commission meeting at 7pm.

The Historic Committee has an opening and is looking for a volunteer. Please contact City Hall for an application if interested. This committee helps guide the city in their efforts to preserve the historic buildings and areas in town. The City of Union is a Certified Local Government with the State Historic Preservation Office and the commission's efforts help ensure this continued designation. This designation also makes the city eligible for grants to further historic preservation efforts. I will be working with this group to plan their goals for the next year.

Committee meetings for Zoning, Parks, Trails, Charter and Water/Sewer continue through the summer. Public participation is encouraged. Please call the office for meeting times. All meetings are at City Hall. The Main Street Union committee organized a great Blues and Brews event on July 26<sup>th</sup> with vendors and music in the park. I hope you had the opportunity to attend. The Grassroots festival is also coming up on August 10<sup>th</sup> with many vendors and booths signed up and hopefully we will have good weather.

My thanks to those who are battling the wildfires in the area and my thoughts and prayers to those who have been directly affected. 

#### What's Happening at the Museum in August....

One of the many interesting features of the Museum is that it can actually provide an insight into life of long ago. One of the outer buildings known as "the carpenters shop" also includes a glimpse of the North Powder Post Office from the early 1900's. In 1899 postal customers had to pick up their mail at the post office since home delivery didn't start until later. The local post office was often the hub of activity not only for mail but for a variety of other necessary services. One could purchase stamps, pick up general delivery mail and use the parcel post service. I read an article about a child being sent via parcel post to visit her grandparents because it was a more economical method of getting the child to the grandparents than a stagecoach ticket. The little girl met the weight and height requirement for the mail service. Rules changed shortly after the child's trip through the mail preventing the mailing of children.

The Museum's post office has a picture of Union's post office in 1888. It was located in the Hall Brothers Store on the corner of Main and Beakman.

If you have ancestors who lived in Union from 1888 to 1912 it might be fun to look through some of the registers to see if any familiar names took advantage of Postal Savings Certificates or Money Orders all issued in Union.

Wanted posters were always placed in post offices and are still posted there to this day. The Museum has two interesting items on display. "Wanted Dead or Alive: Notorious Badman--John Wesley Hardin for the killing of Deputy Sheriff Charles Webb of Brown County, Texas on May 26, 1874. Though courteous and well dressed he is extremely dangerous and is always armed." A more recent wanted by the FBI is from Sept. 19, 1974. "Patricia Campbell Hurst--self proclaimed member of the Symbionese Liberation Army has been in possession of numerous firearms including automatic weapons."

The actual mailboxes from the Telocaset Post Office are on display as well as a very old manual Royal typewriter, a black rotary dial telephone, a small weighing scale, embossing stamps plus albums containing golden replicas of U.S. postage stamps first day issue with pertinent historical information. There is also a fantastic stamp collection that once belonged to Vance Terral, M.D. who was raised in Union, became a doctor and moved to Portland. He returned to Union for frequent visits and when he passed away was buried in the Union Cemetery.

The Third Tuesday program usually held at the Little White Church will be held in La Grande at 7 p.m. at the Fire Museum which is across from the La Grande Post Office (next to Side A) on August 20. Fire Chief Emmitt Cornford will speak about the museum's history and share stories about some city fires. Antique equipment will be on display as well as some modern equipment. We would like to recognize any firemen or volunteer firefighters and would love to hear any stories they would like to share. Pluggie the talking fire hydrant will also attend so be prepared to have some fun. We hope to see you in La Grande August 20 at 7 p.m.



#### Snippet of Union's History.....

Sometime last Saturday night, A.J. Goodbrod, who lives in the south-western portion of town, was awakened by a noise in an adjoining room, and getting up he discovered a burglar going through things at a lively rate, occasionally striking a match to facilitate operations.

A.J. watched him until he went to make his exit through a window, and then gathered him by the scruff of the neck, and brought him to a realizing sense of the danger of the profession. He was landed in jail and will probably get free board at Salem for a year or two
