February had some excitement for the public works crew. If you had not heard, an electrical fire broke out at the City's wastewater treatment plant. Thankfully we were able to keep services churning thanks to some quick work by our public works team controlling the fire and their knowledge of running the plant. We turned the damage over to our insurance carrier and are in process of remediating the damage. Early estimates coming in show the damage to be between \$15,000 - \$20,000 of damage.

Public works continued cleanup of our properties throughout the month and servicing our fleet. With the approval from Council in February, the City will be selling off a few vehicles this coming spring. Please keep an eye out as we will have 3 vehicles to bid on when the time comes.

The City Council had its first reading of Ordinance 565 in February for implementing a transient lodging tax. City Council has set the rate to be 5% and continued public comment will be heard on Ordinance 565 at the March Council meeting. If passed the ordinance will begin on July 1, 2022. For more details or a copy of the ordinance, please contact city Hall.

Budget meeting dates are being set for April 25-27 on the FY 22-23 budget. All budget meetings are open to the public and comments will be taken from the public on April 27, 2022. If you want to know what it takes monetarily to run the City this is a good chance to learn, listen and ask questions. Stay tuned for the times of the meetings, but generally they take place in the evening.

Council continues taking comment on the Buffalo Flats Project. This is not a city project but is being facilitated through the Union County Soil and Water Conservation District. Council needs to hear your voice on the matter so they can bring a strong representation from Union citizens. If you are unsure of the what the Buffalo Flats project is, please see the Union County Soil and Water Conservation website at http://unionswcd.org/ and click the Buffalo Flats tab. This project does have some potential to affect the City flood plain among other weed and pest issues. So please get informed and get with a Councilor so they can hear your views of the project. Council will be scheduling a public hearing soon for this event.

Test Your Cross Connection!! It's The Law.....

Now is the time to begin thinking about testing your cross connections.

The following are Cross Connection example that need yearly inspection.....

- ♦ Wash basins and service sinks
- ♦ Hose bibs
- Irrigation or lawn sprinkler systems
- ♦ Swimming pools and spas
- ♦ Solar heat systems
- Fire sprinkler systems
- ♦ Auxiliary water supplies (wells)
- ♦ Photo developing equipment
- ♦ Laboratory equipment
- ♦ Attachment to hoses to apply weed killer or fertilizer or to flush anti-freeze
- ♦ Food and beverage processing equipment
- ♦ Boilers
- ♦ Chemical feed equipment
- ♦ Ornamental fountains

The City's drinking water system can become unsafe whenever backflow occurs, and the plumbing system comes in contact with harmful or objectionable substances.

The Oregon Department of Human Services <u>requires</u> that all backflow assemblies be tested once each year by a certified tester. If you have one of the above cross-connections please send your test results to the City of Union Water Department. If it is determined that you have not completed the test or failed to come into compliance, the property water will be shut off.

The City of Union works hard to supply customers with safe clean drinking water. With an understanding of the hazards associated with cross-connection and backflow testing you can help us protect our drinking water.

Union Sanitation Notice

Due to significant increases for landfill disposal fees and material recovery facility fees and the costs of operations there will be an increase in your sanitation services beginning in March.

New rates are as follows:

42 Gallon roll cart per week.....\$23.66/month

68 Gallon roll cart per week.....\$28.20/month

96 Gallon roll cart per week......\$32.74/month

Ordinance Education Corner....

Ordinance 99 pertaining to the accumulation and stockpiling of waste within the city limits.

The accumulation and storage of waste is hereby found to create a condition tending to reduce the value of private property, to promote blight, deterioration and unsightliness, to invite plundering, to create fire hazards, to create a harborage for rodents and insects, and to be injurious to the health, safety and general welfare of the inhabitants of the city. Therefore, the presence of waste on private property in violation of this ordinance is declared to constitute a public nuisance which may be fined and/or abated in accordance with provisions of this chapter.

Waste is defined as materials that can decompose, giving rise to foul smelling products, or creating health hazard or which is capable of attracting or providing food for potential disease carriers such as birds, rodents, flies or other vectors.
